His parents hope that an education will help him look at life differently.

Kiruthika comes from a very poor family. Her mother is sickly, while her father is an unskilled labourer, earning a meagre daily-wage. Most days he is unemployed, making the struggle for food and accommodation hard to bear. Kiruthika often missed school – either to care for her mother or when her parents were simply unable to pay her school fees. Hearing of Mizpah Home, her father requested our help in caring for Kiruthika.



Vignesh is a fatherless boy of ten who is quite stunted for his age. Vicky – as we call him – lost his father when he was only five years old. What is most difficult for Vicky and his mother is that Vicky's younger brother is mentally-challenged. Burdened with such a great load – and only her income as a daily-wage earner for support – Vicky's mother sought the help of Mizpah for the care and education of her son. She hopes that Vicky may see better days and that their 'lines will fall in pleasant places.'



Danush is the son of a homeless woman who lives in the places she can find work – and allow her to keep her son with her. His father left while the boy was yet a baby and the mother has no legal bind on him. Now that Danush is growing up his mother is finding it difficult to find a place for the two of them. In her despair, she was advised to seek the help of Mizpah for Danush. After careful consideration, we have taken the boy into our care. He is a happy child, though in poor health. With loving care and an education we believe he too can find newness of life and look to the future with hope and confidence.
